# Warning from Olcott Yacht Club re Harbour

We received a warning from our friends in Olcott New York regarding some errors you may experience with your chart plotter. Here is the message from OYC Harbour Master.

Olcott Harbor has undergone significant changes in the configuration of our harbor entrance after extensive modifications during the summer and fall of 2021.

Please inform your members who may be using an updated chart plotter or have downloaded a recent chart from NOAA that there is a serious error with the depiction of the Olcott Harbor entrance. It is our concern these errors could result in tragic results, especially if one were navigating by these updates in reduced visibility.

The NOAA and Navionic's chart show the channel entrance running straight through the heart of the newly constructed rock break wall. Any mariner following those routes would certainly meet with disaster.

It is our hope to avoid such a disaster.

# Fair Winds and Following Seas to my Beautiful Mother

Among other things, Jessie Mayhew was a sailor. Her father, John Sorensen, was a Danish merchant mariner, who had an anchor tattooed on his forearms. He named her after his first boat, the Jessie. Mom remembers being safely tied to the mast with her sisters when they were very young and sailing in Denmark. She moved to Canada when she was five and loved being a Canadian, inspired by her parents who left war torn Denmark. She became a mother at a young age, as was common in the 1970s, and embraced motherhood with the ferocity and wisdom of a much older woman. Motherhood left little time for sailing through the busy years of childrearing and mortgage paying. After his retirement, her father bought an Alberg 22 and named it the Little Mermaid, harkening to their Danish roots. Together, Mom and my grandfather raced that plucky little sloop all over Lake Ontario.

Mom loved an adventure and she always encouraged me to follow whatever passion inspired me, acting as my greatest champion. As her children grew and her time became her own, she supported me, her daughter (Jessie III), in purchasing an old Redwing 30. With the help of my mom, dad, and grandfather, I restored the Redwing and got it sailing around in the wake of the Alberg.

Mom spent many years sailing the Redwing with me and my dad and then with dad after I moved away and started my own family. Together they travelled all over eastern Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence with friends. My mom always felt these years on the boat were some of the best years of her life. When my husband and I reached the stage in our lives that we could find room in our lives for sailing again, Mom enthusiastically supported our decision to sell the Redwing and buy a bigger boat. By this time, her joints ached, and her muscles complained but she joined us on the long drive to bring our new boat home to Fifty Point. We bought Mom a social membership at Fifty Point for her birthday and she proudly carried her new blue cooler bag everywhere.

Our first holiday was a long sail from Fifty Point to Picton. We picked Mom up in Cobourg and carried on to Picton. Here, Mom was welcomed like an old friend to the Prince Edward Yacht Club where her father had been a long-time member, racer, and volunteer. We spent four beautiful days in Picton reminiscing about the old days when we crossed the lake on the Alberg and the Redwing together. Mom climbed in and out of the cabin like a seasoned sailor, never complaining about the spare conditions of living on a sailboat. We knew it was hard for her, but she never stopped smiling at the sun, wind, sails, and her grandson, Sam, who was also becoming a fine sailor. Mom showed us her favourite anchorage off Glen Island and gave us pointers for anchoring our new boat. We enjoyed a ripping reach down the Picton Bay on a sunny, blustery, afternoon.

That was to be Mom's last sail. We lost Mom in January of 2022, at the too young age of 68. Although it is difficult to imagine a sailing season without her, Mom's enthusiasm for sailing and life has inspired us to take chances, and sail into uncharted waters in life, both at sea and on land.

## **Recipes from Your FPYC Board Members!**

## **KEY LIME CHEESECAKE**

#### For the Crust

2 cups graham cracker crumbs ½ cup butter, melted ¼ cup granulated sugar

#### For the Filling

3 (8 ounce) packages of cream cheese, at room temperature 1 cup of sugar 1 cup of sour cream ¼ cup of flour 2 tsp. vanilla 4 eggs ¾ cup of key lime juice (see note)

**NOTE**: Key Lime juice is slightly sweeter than regular lime juice, but either can be used.  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup of juice makes for a very tart cheesecake. If you prefer less tart, start with  $\frac{1}{3}$  cup and increase to taste. (I found  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup to be good)

Mix together graham crumbs, melted butter and sugar. In the bottom of a 9- or 10-inch springform pan, spread the mixture evenly and halfway up the sides. Bake at 375 for 7-8 minutes, but no longer, and remove from the oven.

Beat cream cheese well, until smooth. Add in sour cream, eggs, (one at a time), flour and vanilla. When completely smooth and without lumps, stir in lime juice.

Pour over prepared crust. Return to 375 oven for 15 minutes. Lower temperature to 250 and continue baking 50 minutes for a 10" pan; 55 minutes for a 9" pan. Cool on a wire rack for 20 minutes. Run a sharp knife around the edge the loosen the cheesecake and help prevent cracking. Refrigerate at least 6 hours before serving. May be topped with whipped cream; lime zest, or both.
