'Eclips' Crew

Racing on Lake Ontario

The fully crewed and shorthanded regattas are numerous, but a couple that might be of interest are the shorthanded series offered by Port Credit YC, and the LOSHR races. FPSC will be running the Peaches & PHRF regatta later this summer also.

Two boats in the marina participated in the Ontario 300 this year. Randy St. Jacques on 'Scrubs' sailed in the fully crewed division of the 'Main Duck Course'. Myself (Garry Cooke) and my twin brother Peter sailed in the double-handed 'Scotch Bonnet' course on 'Eclipse'.

The wind this year was generally better than last year, but there were a couple of dead-air patches. One at Niagara and the other towards Toronto and the finish line. There were three thunderstorms again this year, with winds topping 33 knots. We were able to get the boat up to 11.5 knots of boat speed in one of these blows, with just a main and jib! That is the fastest I have had the boat going since I have owned it. Because of the wind on a broad reach, we were able to pull away from the pack, and maintained 2nd position all the way around until the dead air patch in Niagara, where the 3rd place boat managed to get past us. We were still happy with our performance though, achieving 1st place in the double handed division (NFS) and 3rd overall line honours. My brother was especially thrilled, since he is new to sailing and came over from Britain for the race (as well as to see my father on his 90th birthday of course!).

The race had one unfortunate mishap; fortunately with no injuries. A multi-hull got flipped in the 33 knot winds. USCG rescued the three crew members and placed flashing lights on the upturned hull as a navigation warning until the wreck could be towed. This year saw the least number of retiring boats and was generally successful. The race is exceedingly well organized. The race committee plan the event during the year prior to the race. There are many safety requirements and there is a GPS tracker that shows the position of all boats on the course. (ybtracker.com)



The main functions would be greeting the participants and parents/guardians from 8:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., being available during the participants' lunch break (approx. noon) and helping the sailors take the boats out of the water at 4:00 p.m. It is not a full day commitment but you may want to spend time on the water watching the sailors enjoy their day! One of the two volunteers each day would need access to a dinghy.



Karyn's Kitchen

Well the warm days of summer have finally arrived, so what better than an easy side dish to enjoy. Also perfect for Vegetarians. This is great for a backyard BBQ or Potluck and very quick and easy to prepare. The dressing recipe is also great on many other salads. Happy boating and grilling.



GRILLED POTATO SALAD

Ingredients

- 8 yellow flesh potatoes (scrubbed clean but not peeled, cut into 1 ½ inch cubes)
- 1 bunch asparagus
- 4 tbsp olive oil
- 5 cloves garlic, chopped finely
- 2 tbsp parsley (chopped fresh preferred)
- 2 tbsp parmesan cheese
- 1 cup chopped bell peppers (not green)
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper

Dressing:

1/3 cup olive oil
2 cloves garlic
Zest of 1 lemon
Juice of 1 lemon
2 tsp Dijon Mustard
½ tsp salt
½ tsp pepper

Add potatoes and asparagus to a large Ziplock bag and add oil, garlic and salt and pepper. Mix well and marinate for ½ hour.

Cook potatoes and asparagus on greased medium high grill with lid closed. (or you can use a BBQ mat). Cook asparagus for about 5 minutes, turning once. After cooking, remove from grill and cut asparagus into thirds. Cook potatoes for about 15-20 minutes or until cooked, turning once. Remove from grill and place in large bowl along with asparagus.

Prepare dressing by whisking together all ingredients, except oil. Continue to whisk while gradually adding oil. Add chopped peppers, parsley and Parmesan cheese, mix well and pour over potato/asparagus. Mix to coat and serve. This can be served as a warm potato salad or cold. Serves 8 to 10.
