



New Reciprocal Policy

Below is our revised Reciprocal Policy approved at our Annual General Meeting. Fifty Point Marina has agreed to manage the policy based on a new computerized way to make managing easy.

FPYC is located within the 200 acre Fifty Point Conservation Area. The Fifty Point Marina is owned and operated by the Hamilton Conservation Authority.

FPYC members rent slips from the Authority. There are over 300 slips in the marina. Not all boats are members of the Yacht Club; however, reciprocal visitors may be assigned any available slip.

- FPYC provides the first night free mooring and reciprocal privileges to current members of all yacht clubs on Lake Ontario.
- FPYC offers three one night reciprocal visits per season.
- Reciprocals may not be used the day before or the day after Club Cruises or Fifty Point basin regattas.
- Visitors are required to show both a club burgee and a current membership card to the marina gas dock staff as they manage all slip assignments.
- If you are planning a weekend visit, you are welcome to contact the marina to inquire about expected availability of slips. Reservations are not normally required but can be arranged if necessary with the marina staff. Checking ahead with the marina is recommended for larger vessels especially when planning to visit on a long weekend.
- If a reservation is required FPYC will pay for the first night for your reserved slip.

Our cruising members greatly appreciate the hospitality extended by other yacht clubs around the lake. FPYC is happy to welcome you to Fifty Point Marina. We wish you a safe and happy boating season and hope you consider Fifty Point in your summer travel plans.

FPYC Visitors to Your Club

Not every boat in Fifty Point marina is a FPYC member. When a boat from "Fifty Point" visits your club, please be sure to ask to see their current membership card and burgee to ensure they are a FPYC member.



Karyn's Kitchen

As many of our marina friends know, we love to spend some time in the Florida Keys in the winter. Those of you lucky enough to have tried them will agree that Key West Pink Shrimp are the best! With that in mind, this inspired me to send one of my favourite recipes for this month's Scuttlebutt. While you likely won't be able to get this kind of shrimp at home, it will still be delicious. I suggest a medium to large size shrimp for this dish, usually 4 to 5 per person works well in the dish. Enjoy!



SHRIMP SCAMPI PASTA

- 1 lb shrimp, cleaned and deveined
- 1 shallot onion-chopped
- 3-4 cloves garlic-finely chopped
- ¹/₂ cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- ¹/₂ cup white wine
- ½ tsp oregano
- ¹/₄ cup butter
- 2 tbsp fresh parsley
- 1 cup panko
- 3 tbsp butter
- Capellini (you can substitute spaghetti or linguine)
- Chives-chopped (about 1 tsp)
- Freshly grated Reggiano Parmesan cheese (about ¹/₂ cup)
- Sauté shrimp in olive oil until slightly brown on one side, flip and cook briefly until slightly underdone. Remove from pan to a side plate.
- Add shallots for a couple of minutes, add a bit more olive oil and garlic & oregano. Cook until just softened.
 Deglaze with wine, salt and pepper and cook for a few minutes. Add ¼ cup butter and stir, sauce will thicken after butter is added. Add shrimp back in, remove from heat and add parsley.

Panko crumbs

Brown 3 tbsp. butter until just starting to brown. Add panko crumbs and remove from heat. Stir until crumbs are slightly toasted. Add chopped chives, oregano and lemon zest. Stir about 2 minutes. Reserve and keep warm.

While preparing shrimp mixture, cook pasta until slightly undercooked and reserve about 1 cup pasta water. Add pasta to shrimp mixture with a bit of pasta water and mix, adding more pasta water if needed until desired consistency. Pour unto serving platter or individual plates. Top with panko crumbs and parmesan cheese. Serves 4
