



Last year it was RCYC, this year it's another club with an "R" in it. For a number of years the Commodore's Cruise was an anchor cruise to Carrols Point. It makes for a very short and easy trip into RHYC the next day. Those of you who are not signed up for that cruise are still very welcome to join us for the Friday night.

Chicken & Mushroom Kabobs



Ingredients:

2 tablespoons Olive Oil
2 tablespoons Lemon Juice
1 teaspoon zest of lemon
1 clove garlic crushed
Salt and Pepper to taste
Chicken Tenders
16 cremini or button mushrooms
4 Green Onions
8 wooden skewers, soaked
lemon wedges for serving

Directions

Toss chicken with olive oil, lemon juice, zest, garlic, salt and pepper.
Thread chicken/veal onto skewers by folding each strip 2-3 times to press meat together
Alternate with green onions and mushrooms. (red pepper)
Grill over barbecue preheated to medium-high, 2 to 3 min. per side or until meat is just cooked through and mushrooms are tender.
Serve with lemon wedges.

Option: I tried raw shrimp and it was delicious. The original recipe called for veal scaloppini.



July Race Report

FPYC Yacht Racing Season

The racing season is well under way, with racing every Tuesday evening at 6:30 p.m., with our neighbor club at Newport. Race results are posted on the notice board outside the Marina office (south side) and we currently have about 15 boats racing, and would enjoy having a few more. Everyone is welcome to come out.

The last pursuit fun race was on Sunday June 26th in the afternoon. The wind was quite favourable at 15-20 knots from the south, allowing a great run along the shore towards Newport and back to Fifty Point. Due to the higher winds forecast some of the pre-registered boats did not participate (but they missed a great sail!).

The results of the race were:

- 1] 'Eclipse' Garry & Katherine Cooke
- 2] 'Ashera' Stephen & Ann Middleton
- 3] 'Patience' Doug & Judie Galvin

The race was close between first and second place, with Ashera leading up to the mark on the first leg, but Eclipse squeezed past at the mark and led the way back to the finish.

The next race is scheduled for Sunday, July 24th with a Skippers Meeting at 1:00 p.m. at 'D' dock rain shelter. I would like to have a BBQ afterwards, but I need to know if there is any interest and also how many people will be coming. There would be a small charge for food, depending on what is required (e.g. burgers and salads etc.) Please send me an e-mail beforehand so I can work out start times ahead of time. The notice of future race dates can be found on the calendar on the FPYC website, and also on the club notice board at the main Marina Office.

Yacht Racing Global Update

The single-handed racing community is getting ready for the next big around the world race, the Vendee Globe, which starts in October from France. A race from New York last month allowed single-handed sailors to test and qualify their boats and themselves as they raced to Les Sables D'Olonne, in their 60 to 70 foot racing machines.

The first place boat crossed from New York in just over 9 days, with some light winds towards the end of the race that changed the relative positions of the leaders. When I crossed the Atlantic a few years ago on the 60 foot 'Spirit of Canada', it took us about 13 days, and that was with 3 days being almost becalmed at the beginning, but we did have four persons onboard as opposed to the single-handed racers, and Halifax is a little closer than New York.

Many of the new boats are using not only Carbon composites, but many are using additional fin-like keels/wings, that are actually horizontal with winglets (similar to Airbus and Boeing wingtips) and project out through the side of the boat.

There is one fitted on each side, and they serve to provide a vertical force (lift) from the wing fin that reduces the heel of the vessel, allowing the boat to carry more sail, and hence go faster!



Sailboat Pursuit Racing

Pursuit style racing is a simplified fun style racing. Each boat is given their own start time based on the type of boat, the size of sail carried etc. The boats are handicapped by adjusting the start time, so that the boats although starting at different times (perhaps up to 5-8 minutes from the first to last boat) will finish relatively close together, so that the first boat to cross the line is the winner, the second boat is second etc.

There is no need to wait for the results to be handicapped after the finish in order to determine the winner. You can see who is winning by the order of the boats crossing the line.

We plan to use this format for races throughout the year. (Please check the FPYC.ca calendar for more information)


Hitching a Ride...




