

### **Sheet Bend**

Need to lengthen a thick clothesline, but all you have is a thin piece of rope? Don't fret. The sheet bend can lend a helping hand. The knot, also known as, becket bend, weaver's hitch or weaver's knot, though recommended for joining ropes of different diameters, is equally effective for ropes of equal thicknesses as well. It owes the name weaver's knot to its historical use in textile mills. However, weavers tend to tie it in a variety of ways. Its importance has led it to feature as the first knot in The Ashley Book of Knots.





### Keeping children afloat

A lifejacket or PFD is no substitute for adult supervision. Children should be within arm's reach as well as wearing a proper flotation device at all times. <u>View this video for quick tips on keeping your child safe on water</u>.

Buy only Canadian-approved devices. Have your child try on the device before you buy it.

- It should fit snugly and not ride up over your child's chin or ears.
- There should be less than 7.6 cm (3") between your child's shoulders and the device. Otherwise, the device is too big and could do more harm than good.

Look for these safety features:

- a large collar for head support
- waist ties or elastic gathers in front and back
- a safety strap that goes between the legs to prevent the device from slipping over your child's head
- buckles on safety straps and reflective tape

Look for a lifejacket or PFD with a label that says the device has been approved by any of the organizations below:

- Transport Canada
- Canadian Coast Guard
- Fisheries and Oceans Canada

Do you have any approved children's life jackets that your kids have out grown? Are they still in great shape? Consider donating them to the Club's new lifejacket/PFD borrow bin. A bin will be set up in the Club House if you need to borrow a child's lifejacket, see if the correct size is available, sign it out and bring it back dry for the next person to use. ### WELLAND CANAL Lockage Schedule for Pleasure Craft

Effective July 15, 2019, the St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation is implementing a pleasure craft schedule for transits through the Welland Canal.

The service offering will be based upon the following schedule:

#### Upbound Transits - from Port Weller to Port Colborne

Transits are available on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, & Sunday.

On the day of transit, pleasure crafts must be in position at the Port Weller small boat dock with payment confirmed and registration completed with the Seaway's Operations Control Centre by 9:00 a.m.

\*\*Pleasure crafts registered after the 9:00 a.m. cut off time will not transit until the next scheduled operating day.\*\*

#### Downbound Transits - from Port Colborne to Port Weller

Transits are available on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.

On the day of transit, pleasure crafts must be in position at the Port Colborne small boat dock with payment confirmed and registration completed with the Seaway's Operations Control Centre by 9:00 a.m.

\*\*Pleasure crafts registered after the 9:00 a.m. cut off time will not transit until the next scheduled operating day.\*\*

During transits, pleasure crafts are to communicate with the Operations Control Center (OCC), utilizing Seaway working frequency Channel 14 (unless otherwise instructed by the OCC).




Entrance to National Yacht Club

### **Maple Grilled Corn**

Here's a decidedly Canadian twist on one of the world's most popular veggies.

60 ml (1/4 cup) pure maple syrup 120 ml (1/2 cup) melted butter Salt and pepper, to taste 12 ears of corn, husks and silks removed

- 1. Preheat the grill to high.
- 2. In a bowl, combine the maple syrup, butter, salt and pepper. Set aside.
- 3. Remove the first layer of husks from each ear of corn.
- 4. Gently spread out the remaining husk leaves, remove the corn silk and baste the corn with the maple-butter mixture. Pat the remaining husks back around the cob and wrap each in aluminum foil.
- 5. Place corn on the grill and close the cover.
- 6. After four minutes, give the corn a quarter turn and close the cover. Repeat three times until all four sides have been grilled (a total of 16 minutes). Unwrap, remove husks and enjoy!


