2019 SAIL PAST



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
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Hello everyone,


Round Turn and Two Half Hitches

The strong knot consists of two parts, a round turn and two half hitches. The first part takes the initial strain and controls the load as you complete the knot. It also provides friction against the support.

It is critical for holding mooring lines. It fastens a rope to a fixed object such as a post, tree, ring or column. It retains 75% of the line strength.
















Karyn's Kitchen

What goes better with a Summer BBQ or pasta than delicious garlic bread and this one is even better with yummy Asiago Cheese. You can substitute with Cheddar or any other of your favourite cheeses that melts well. This makes a great appetizer to share too. Bon Appetit!



ASIAGO CHEESY GARLIC BREAD

- Sour dough round bread
- 1 stick butter
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 3 cloves garlic- chopped
- Fresh parsley
- 1 cup grated asiago cheese
- Melt butter in saucepan. Add 2 tsp olive oil, garlic and chopped parsley
- Cut bread into thick slices, but not to the bottom of the bread. Do ½ turn and cut into the
 other direction.
- Put a large sheet of tin foil on a cookie sheet or pizza pan. Put bread in center. Brush butter mixture between slices of bread throughout. Add cheese, being sure to get some between bread slices. Put remaining cheese over top of bread. Tent foil over bread, but don't fully seal and be careful to not have foil touching top of bread or cheese will stick to it.
- Bake in 400-degree oven for 10 minutes remove and take foil off the top of the bread. Bake another 5 to 8 minutes until cheese is slightly browned on top. (this can also be done on the BBQ, but best to put pan on the side of the BBQ without the burner on underneath, so as to avoid burning the bottom).
- Break apart to serve.

Ticks and Lyme Disease - What you need to know

A tick is very small and can range in size from a poppy seed to a small grape (when engorged). They do not jump or fly.

Ticks are normally found in forested areas or areas with long grass, where they attach themselves to humans and animals passing by.

On humans, ticks normally attach to areas such as the groin, armpits, hairline or behind the ears.


