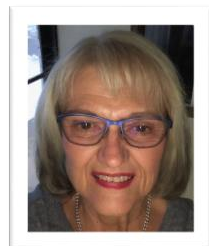

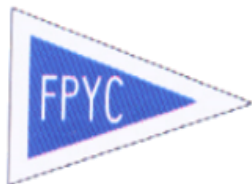

Well we are starting to look like a marina again as the staff at Fifty Point work diligently putting boats in the water.

Hopefully many of you are or will be going in the water again this year. We know that approximately 60 boats are staying on the hard this year. But not all were members of FPYC.

We weighed the pros and cons of storing a boat for 18 months and the potential issues related to fuel, (for us gas people), mold and non-operation of systems. We also looked at the monies we would save by staying on the hard versus the potential costs to remedy any issues that developed. This is why we decided to launch.

We are also hopeful that many things will return to a new normal and we can enjoy the social distancing get-togethers with many friends. After all boating is a social activity that many of us miss. We also recognize that the marina is doing the best they can with the directions being given by both the Province and Hamilton Conservation Authority. Some things are just outside our marina folks' control.

But unfortunately travelling to other locals is not really an option for us this year. Fifty Point Marina has informed us that they are not taking reciprocals under the existing conditions for the added health and safety of their staff. Therefore, FPYC has notified our reciprocal partners that we are not taking reciprocals in 2020 and hope that we may return to 'normal' in 2021. This is in keeping with many other yacht clubs.

We recognize that this was a necessary step given that some clubs are either not putting boats in the water this year or are trying to work around social distancing rules to launch boats with a crane.

Given that this is an unusual year FPYC Executive is trying to do the best that we can. It is recognized that some decisions might not be desired. If you have comments, we would be glad to listen. But proactive is much better than reactive. We can always use members help to have the best for members.

COVID-19: SAFE BOATING FOR CANADIANS TO REDUCE THE BURDEN ON EMERGENCY RESPONDERS



DO YOU PLAN TO USE YOUR BOAT, CANOE, KAYAK, PADDLE BOARD OR ANOTHER KIND OF PLEASURE CRAFT?

Staying home saves lives; but if you are going to travel on the water, be prepared. Check any provincial, territorial, local and regional health measures regarding social gatherings, physical distancing, or non-essential services to ensure boating is allowed locally.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, emergency responders are working at full capacity to ensure the safety and health of Canadians. To reduce pressure on emergency services, including search and rescue services, the following measures are strongly recommended for pleasure craft operators and everyone on board:

- **Wear a lifejacket or Personal Flotation Device (PFD):**
 - Lifejackets/PFDs are required by law to be on board for each person on all types of pleasure craft.
 - Wear them at all times when on deck or in the cockpit.
 - Make sure they are of the proper size, and properly buckled up.
 - » Most recreational boaters who die on the water each year in Canada are not wearing personal flotation devices, or are not wearing them properly.

- **Ensure your pleasure craft is in good working order and properly equipped before heading out on the water.**
 - Verify all your safety equipment before departure.
 - Verify that your engine(s), bilge pumps and other systems are in good working order.
 - Make sure you have enough fuel for the voyage, with a safety reserve.
 - » More than 50% of calls for assistance from recreational boaters are because of mechanical failure, including running out of fuel.
- **Limit the length of your trips as much as possible, departing and returning to the same location and avoiding stops along the way.**
- **Keep a safe distance to shore at all times.**
- **Avoid using your pleasure craft during bad weather and extreme temperatures.**
- **Limit using your pleasure craft to daylight hours.**

Pleasure craft operators and everyone on board are asked to avoid any unnecessary contact with others during their trip.

As always, boaters are directed to operate at safe speeds. Don't cruise while drinking alcohol or using cannabis.

CHEESY NACHOS AND MARGARITAS

NACHOS

1 bag Restaurant Style nachos

1 jar salsa

1 ½ cups grated cheese (Mexican Blend works best, but you can use Cheddar)

3 green onions or ½ cup red onion, chopped

½ cup each red and green peppers, chopped

½ cup jalapeno peppers (jar version is fine)

½ cup chopped olives (optional)

Arrange nachos evenly on a large cookie sheet. Top evenly with onions, peppers, jalapenos, olives and cheese.

Sprinkle salsa in teaspoonful's over nachos, as evenly as possible. Be generous, but don't drown them in salsa or they will be mushy. Bake at 375 degrees for about 5-10 minutes until cheese is melted. You can do this on the BBQ too but best to do on indirect heat (only one side of BBQ on, place pan on side not lit) or they may burn.

MARGARITAS

1 ½ Oz good tequila (quality of tequila really makes a difference)

1 oz orange liqueur (Cointreau, Triple Sec or Grand Marnier)

¾ cup fresh squeezed lime juice (you can use bottled, but fresh works best)

1 oz simple syrup (recipe below).

Salt for rim (optional). Coarse salt works best.

Lots of ice!!

Rub rim of glass with lime and dip in salt (optional). Add tequila, orange liqueur, lime juice and simple syrup to a shaker with about a cup of ice. Shake well to blend. Pour over glass filled with lots of ice. This recipe makes one drink, but easily multiplied to make more, since they are more fun when shared!

SIMPLE SYRUP

1 cup sugar

1 cup water

Place both in small pan, heat over medium heat just until sugar is completely melted. This can be stored in fridge for a few weeks
