FPYC Race Report May2015

As mentioned earlier, if you wish to race and receive a handicap measurement, please contact me so that I can help with your sail measurements. We will be measuring sails at 9:00 am on Saturday May 9th. (please contact me to confirm)

For PHRF all spinnakers and mains will need to be measured this year, due to changes in the rules. It is easier to measure your main sail prior to attaching the sail to your boat, since the sail will need to be stretched out on the grass.

Racing on Tuesday will start on Tuesday, June 19th with Newport YC. If you wish to race you will need to register with me. Thursday Pursuit races will start on Thursday June 4th.

We will run a Saturday pursuit race in May, and I will send out a notice prior to that. If you wish to participate in Thursday's racing, you will need to register with me.

Pub Nights 2015

Pub nights have concluded this year, with the last one in April covering basic rules of the road for power boats as well as sail boats, together with the simple rules applied to pursuit style racing. We will be starting up pub nights again after the boats are back on the 'hard'!

FPYC MEMBERSHIP E-Transfer


We Are Now Accepting E-Transfer for your FPYC Membership Fees

Orange Sesame Noodles with Grilled Shrimp

Sauce

Combine first 7 ingredients in bowl:

- 1/4 cup fresh orange juice
- 3 T soya sauce
- 3 T peanut butter
- 2 T toasted sesame oil
- 2 tea freshly grated ginger
- 2 tea grated orange zest
- 1/4 tea cayenne pepper

Pasta

10 oz noodles (I like angel hair noodles)

1 cup snow peas

1 carrot, cut matchsticks

1 1/2 pounds large shrimp, peeled and deveined

1 T toasted sesame oil

To Prepare:

Boil noodles

Before draining add snow peas and carrot, let cook 30 seconds

Drain and toss with orange juice mixture, set aside

Brush shrimp w sesame oil and grill over med-hot coals 3-5 mins

Arrange pasta on plates and top with shrimp

Variation:

Omit the shrimp if you want to make a vegetarian option, or top with grilled chicken strips, pork or steak.


Meet Your Executive Cruising Director Sue Millar
