MAY HISTORY LESSON

THE SAILPAST

The Sailpast tradition began at the first Yacht Club that was formed at Cowes in England nearly 200 years ago. The membership at Cowes was primarily aristocratic and many were familiar with naval practice and tradition. Cowes Yacht Club subsequently changed its name to the Royal Yacht Squadron and certain social graces were added to the traditional naval practices.

The actual "review of the fleet" is steeped in more than 600 years of Royal Navy tradition and history and was introduced in Yacht clubs as a continuation of the naval habit of having Admirals (and/or Royalty) review the fleet on special occasions.

Protocol demanded that a flagship be anchored with the Admiral and staff on the quarterdeck to receive and return the salute. Vessels sailed past, dipping their colours in salute, and with their captain also saluting with the ship's company standing at attention. The Vice Admiral would lead the fleet passing in review and the final vessel in the line would carry the Rear Admiral.

Our Yacht Club tradition is almost identical, except that the salute is received by the Commodore instead of the Admiral and the salute is delivered by the passing boat, if under sail, by luffing its jib, or, if under power, by dipping its ensign. All of the crew on the saluting boat stands at attention facing the Commodore, who is the only one to salute by hand. If there is insufficient wind, sailboats should have their engines on. By precedent, Sailpast is a formal event that officially opens the boating season. The Navy and many yacht clubs also follow the Sailpast with a "Blessing of the Fleet", a long standing European tradition, first practiced in Portugal, of seeking divine providence to those who laboured or ventured on the sea to assure good harvest, safe passage and safe return.

At FPYC the Sailpast begins with 62 Phantom Squadron Air Cadets Colour Guard, Pipes and Drums procession from J dock to the gas dock for the blessing of the boats and the Commodore's comments followed with the Sailpast, salute and everyone joining together afterwards for a scrumptious BBQ.

- > Roast beef and condiments supplied by FPYC.

LIMANI will now be operated by myself (George) and my wife Maria.

- Name change- LIMANI means PORT in Greek and Italian; we wanted a fresh start to the restaurant and a name that represented the cuisine and setting that we will be offering.
- **New design** We have made some changes to the interior and exterior that will make the restaurant more inviting for our members as well as new visitors to fifty point.
- Our Menu- Our menu will be a mix of Greek and Italian dishes such as marinated grilled lamb chops, golden fried calamari, grilled octopus, fettucine carbonara and mussels marinara to mention a few. We will also offer favourites such as halibut fish and chips, homemade burgers, nachos, wings and kids menu.

We have plans to build an outdoor bar as well to catch some rays while you're watching your favourite sports team.

GAMRU Receives \$10,000 Donation!



Rescue boat campaign sails ahead on major NRB Inc. donation

GRIMSBY, Ontario (April 2, 2018) — The campaign to replace the aging inflatable rescue boat patrolling the south shore of Lake Ontario took a big step ahead recently with a substantial donation from a highly respected local business.

NRB Inc. has committed \$10,000 to the campaign to replace the fast-response vessel manned by volunteers from GAMRU South Shore Search And Rescue, the two organizations announced this week.

The generous donation boosts the campaign's total to more than \$80,000 in funds on-hand or committed. The goal of the campaign is \$300,000 — the estimated cost of a new, purpose-built fast-response rescue boat.

"Safety on the water impacts so many people from the community and an ambitious project like this was something we felt we could support," explained NRB Inc. president Bob McNeil. "Boating touches every age and demographic in our region and a volunteer agency offering the kind of service these people offer makes all of our communities stronger."

Formed in 1979, the family-owned NRB is based in Grimsby and also has operations in New Holland, Pennsylvania. The company is a leader in the growing field of designing, engineering and constructing quality modular buildings for a long list of commercial, retail, institutional and industrial customers. The firm is a highly regarded member of the local business community.

"Raising the kind of funds we need for a new vessel is a long, slow process. It can be frustrating but this kind of donation really propels our campaign forward," said GAMRU unit leader Bob Gordon. "A donation like this from a respected local company like NRB is very, very gratifying."

The fundraising campaign seeks support from government and institutional donors as well as key local industries and received a major commitment last year from the Wise Guys Charity Fund. The volunteer group hopes to have a new vessel in service by next year.

It is the second major donation announced by the group in the past week. The St. Catharines Game & Fish Association last week donated funds for a new suite of navigation equipment for one of the rescue crew's existing boats.

Founded in 1988, GAMRU is the only dedicated marine search and rescue organization on the south shore of Lake Ontario from Hamilton to Port Weller. More than 30 active volunteers maintain fully-equipped rescue vessels and train year-round to maintain the skills and readiness to be effective on the water. GAMRU is a member of the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary and a registered charity.
