Cruising Update

Welcome back for what promises to be another great summer of cruising! With boats now in the water, the 2023 cruising season will soon be upon us. We have been busy over the winter putting together a great schedule which includes visiting some perennial favourites as well as some new destinations. There will be something for everyone!

Our season starts off with a shakedown cruise to Royal Hamilton YC on June 10-11. If you haven't had the chance to visit RHYC before, the club has excellent facilities including an outdoor pool and a great bar with an outdoor patio. RHYC is within walking distance to Bayfront Park and the many shops, pubs and restaurants along James Street.

Canada Day long weekend (July 1-3) will see us visit National Yacht Club in the heart of downtown Toronto. The dining room and bar features a large outdoor, wrap-around terrace with the best view of Lake Ontario, sunsets over the water and the city skyline. This cruise promises to be a memorable one and a great place to celebrate Canada's birthday!

On July 22-23, we will head the other way as we visit Dalhousie Yacht Club. DYC features a beautiful clubhouse and is within walking distance to many great restaurants and pubs with live music. Port Dalhousie's close location to FPYC and the beautiful sandy beach with shallow water also make this a great destination for families with young children.

The long weekend in August (5-7) brings the return visit to Port Credit Yacht Club in Mississauga. The club is located within walking distance of many trails, parks and the beautiful village of Port Credit. If you prefer to stay closer to the boat, the club's beautiful facilities feature casual, patio and fine-dining options. There is also a beautiful pool and several fire pits where you can gather with friends and enjoy an evening cocktail.

Finally, we will close out the 2023 season with a 3-day cruise to Etobicoke Yacht Club from September 2-4. Nestled in the protected waters of Humber Bay, EYC is in close proximity to both the city and Toronto Islands If you're looking for something to do while there, the Canadian National Exhibition will be in full-swing that weekend.

FPYC has a cap of 15 boats per cruise. To make cruises as accessible as possible to all members, registration for up to 3 of the posted cruises will be allowed. Selections will be made on a first-come, first-serve basis. We will maintain a waitlist for cancellations for oversubscribed dates.

Registration for all cruises will open on Thursday, June 1. Watch for an email earlier that week with further instructions.

Getting To Know You...

Masego – Art and Fya Veldhuizen

You no doubt have passed our boat many times, heading out or back into our Marina. We are docked on J13, formally known as "Exile Island".

We were introduced to sailing when we were in our 20's sailing out of Point Albino on my cousins small motorless wooden sailboat. We both were hooked!

Years later, we started sailing on our own, with a great instructor, on a Shark (SNAFU) out of Sugarloaf Marina in Port Colborne. We quickly learned the fundamentals of sailing and joined in on race nights.

In 2006, we bought our first boat, a Catalina30 out of Wilson NY. She was named "Second Thoughts", a name we knew had to be changed. Over the winter, we did a boat name search and compiled a list of names on our fridge. We practiced "hailing" each name to see how each name sounded. We decided on "Masego", which is spoken by the "Bantu" tribe in Botswana, meaning "Blessings". We are very blessed to have a sailboat.

We sailed Masego out of Port Dalhousie for 10 years. A year prior to coming to Fifty Point, we purchased our current boat, a Catalina34, and kept the same meaningful name.

Coincidentally, we sold our Catalina 30, back to the same owners we purchased her from in Wilson NY! Fya suggested they rename her "Second Chance".

When we moved to Fifty Point, John Robinson and Betty VanKlink on "Intuition" were the only people we knew and have been boat neighbours for 6 years now. Betty said they joined the yacht club and immediately became involved on the board as a way to meet new people, she is correct! This will be my 5th year serving on the board.

Being members at FPYC, has enabled us to visit numerous yacht clubs on Lake Ontario, and thoroughly enjoyed the hospitality of each club.

Over the years, Masego has travelled to the Thousand Islands many times via the Canadian and US routes. Always an Adventure!

When we come home to Fifty Point, we are so grateful that this is our home port!

Golden Globe Race by: Garry Cooke

I would imagine that nearly everyone has heard of the original Golden Globe race which was sponsored in 1968 by the Sunday Times newspaper. The recognised sailor Sir Robin Knox-Johnston was the winner and only one to complete the race, the other 8 having retired, sunk or died. A recent movie about Donald Cowhurst shows the mental anguish this race caused, with his ultimate suicide.

The race was devised to create a non-stop un-assisted single handed sailboat race around the world, passing the great Capes in the southern Ocean, such as Cape Town, Cape Leeuwin, Cape Horn and returning up the Atlantic to Europe.

On the 50th anniversary of the race in 2018, an Australian adventurer/sailor Don McIntyre resurrected the idea of sailing the same course in yachts of similar design as the 1968 vessels, using only navigation tools from that period such as sextants. No modern GPS or Chart plotters or other modern instruments were allowed. There were 18 boats entered and only 5 finished the grueling 9 month race. The winner of the 2018 race was a French sailor Jean-Luc Van Den Heede who was 73 years old at the start of the race.

The current edition of the race which started 8 months ago is nearing its conclusion. As I write this article there are three boats remaining in the non-stop division from the original 23. After 30,000 miles the two leading boats are only about 30 miles



apart! The finish is estimated to be April 29th, with only 1000 miles to go to the finish line at Les Sables-d'Olonne, France.

The two leading boats are Kirsten Neuschafer from South Africa and Abhilash Tomy from India. Kirsten was leading by about 1000 miles at one point, but she got stuck in the Doldrums coming North and Abhilash caught up with her. The third boat is skippered by Michael Guggenberger from Austria, and he is about 2500 miles from the finish.

Kirsten actually has support from Newfoundland and Maritime provinces where she had the boat re-outfitted for the race, so she has a strong following from the region. She has been honoured recently with a seamanship award for rescuing a fellow competitor in the race whose boat sank between Cape Town and Australia.

Check out the website and keep an eye on the sailing news for the conclusion of their race. I am hoping Kirsten can hang on to the lead, but in reality, they are all winners in this race: to accomplish a solo 30,000 mile non-stop voyage without modern equipment is something to be proud of.

Spicy Watermelon Margarita

Ingredients

- 2 cups seedless watermelon cubes
- 1 lime wedge
- 1 pinch kosher salt

ice cubes

- 1 ½ fluid ounces silver tequila
- **¾** fluid ounce orange-flavored liqueur (such as Cointreau®)
- ¾ fluid ounce lime juice
- 1 thin slice jalapeno slice, plus more for garnish
- 1 watermelon wedge

Directions

Puree watermelon in a blender. Wipe the rim of a margarita glass with a lime wedge; dip rim in salt.

In a cocktail shaker half-filled with ice, add tequila, orange liqueur, lime juice, jalapeño, and 2 ounces of the watermelon puree. Shake until very cold.

Strain into prepared glass. Garnish with watermelon wedge and jalapeño slice
