"Pot's" and Pans

What happens when whoopie and pumpkin pies meet? Naturally, we get Pumpkin Whoopie Pies with Cinnamon Cream Cheese Icing. These fragrant, moist pumpkin cookies filled with fluffy cream cheese make these Pumpkin Whoopie Pies the perfect hand-held dessert.

Pumpkin Whoopie Pies

Ingredients

2 cups packed brown sugar

- 1 cup vegetable oil
 - 1 1⁄2 cups solid pack pumpkin puree

2 large eggs

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 tablespoon ground ginger
- $\ensuremath{^{\prime\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!\!}}$ tablespoon ground cloves

Cinnamon Cream Cheese Whoopie Pie Filling 1 egg white

- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- ¾ cup cream cheese
- ¼ teaspoon cinnamon

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease baking sheets.

Combine the oil and brown sugar. Mix in the pumpkin and eggs, beating well. Add the flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, 1 teaspoon vanilla, cinnamon, ginger and cloves. Mix well.

Drop dough by heaping teaspoons onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 10 to 12 minutes. Let cookies cool then make sandwiches from two cookies filled with Whoopie Pie Filling. To Make Whoopie Pie Filling: Beat egg white and mix with the milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla and 1 cup of the confectioners' sugar. Mix well, then beat in the cream cheese and the remaining cup of confectioners' sugar. Beat until light and fluffy.
